# Florida in-state tuition guide for completing the “Florida Residency Declaration for Tuition Purposes” form

The “Florida Residency Declaration for Tuition Purposes” form can be found on the website of your higher education institution. It can also be located [here](#). This guide is designed to assist students from immigrant families with the completion of the residency form.



## FLORIDA RESIDENCY DECLARATION FOR TUITION PURPOSES

A Florida “resident for tuition purposes” is a person who has, or a dependent person whose parent or legal guardian has, established and maintained legal residency in Florida for at least twelve (12) consecutive months preceding the first day of classes of the term for which Florida residency is sought.

- Residence in Florida must be a bona fide domicile rather than for the purpose of maintaining a residence incident to enrollment at an institution of higher education.
- To qualify as a Florida resident for tuition purposes, you must be a U.S. citizen, a foreign national in a nonimmigrant visa classification that grants you the legal ability to establish a bona fide domicile in the United States, a permanent resident alien, parolee, asylee, Cuban-Haitian entrant, legal alien granted indefinite stay, or other qualified alien as defined under federal law. Other persons not meeting the twelve-month legal residence requirements may be classified as Florida residents for tuition purposes only if they fall within one of the limited special categories authorized by the Florida Legislature pursuant to section 1009.21, Florida Statutes (see “Qualification by Exception” below). All other persons are ineligible for classification as a Florida “resident for tuition purposes.”
- Living in or attending school in Florida will not, in itself, establish legal residence. Students who depend upon out-of-state parents for support are presumed to be legal residents of the same state as their parents.
- Residency for tuition purposes requires the establishment of legal ties to the state of Florida. A student must verify that the student has broken ties to other states if the student or, in the case of a dependent student, his or her parent has moved from another state.

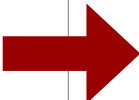
### **NON-FLORIDA RESIDENT**

I do not qualify as a Florida resident for tuition purposes for the term for which this application is submitted. I understand that should I qualify for a future term, it will be necessary for me to submit an updated Residency Declaration while providing prescribed supporting documentation to substantiate as “reclassification” of my status. I understand being classified as a non-Florida resident will not exclude me from the possibility of receiving a waiver to cover part or all of the out-of-state fee as defined in s. 1009.26, Florida Statutes. Submission of an updated Residency Declaration must occur prior to the beginning of the term for which residency is sought. ## **UNDOCUMENTED/DACA STUDENTS**

If you wish to petition for in-state tuition based on status as an **undocumented or DACA** student, you need **only** complete the **“Non-Florida Resident”** portion of the “Florida Residency Declaration for Tuition Purposes” form, which can be found at the bottom of page one of the residency form. In addition to this form, be sure to also submit your Florida high school transcript(s) and an out-of-state fee waiver form, which can be found on your institution’s webpage. Each school may have a different name for the tuition waiver form; contact your school if you need assistance locating it.



## FLORIDA RESIDENCY DECLARATION FOR TUITION PURPOSES

A Florida "resident for tuition purposes" is a person who has, or a cohabitant, person whose parent or legal guardian has, established and maintained legal residence in Florida for at least twelve (12) consecutive months preceding the first day of classes of the term for which Florida residency is sought.

- Residence in Florida must be bona fide domicile (other than for the purpose of maintaining a residence incident to enrollment in an institution of higher education).
- To qualify as a Florida resident for tuition purposes, you must be a U.S. citizen or foreign national in a permanent lawful classification that grants you the legal ability to establish a bona fide domicile in the United States, a permanent resident alien (parolee, asylum, Cuban Hatian entry, legal alien granted indefinite stay, or other qualified alien as defined under federal law). Other persons not meeting the two-month legal residence requirement may be classified as Florida residents for tuition purposes only if they fall within one of the limited special categories authorized by the Florida Legislature pursuant to section 1009.21, Florida Statutes (see "Qualification by Exception" below). A citizen or national is eligible for classification as a Florida resident for tuition purposes.
- Living in or attending school in Florida will not, in itself, establish legal residence. Students who depend upon one or more parents for support are presumed to be legal residents of the same state as their parents.
- Residency for tuition purposes requires the establishment of legal ties to the state of Florida. A student must verify that the student has broken ties to other states if the student or, in the case of a dependent student, his or her parent, has moved from another state.

If you wish to petition for in-state tuition as a **citizen with undocumented parent(s)**, you must complete the entirety of the "Florida Residency Declaration for Tuition Purposes" form, minus the "Non-Florida Resident" portion located at the bottom of page one of the residency form.

I qualify as a resident for tuition purposes as defined by s. 1009.21, Florida Statutes, for the term for which this application is submitted. I understand that it will be necessary for me to provide evidence of residency for tuition purposes, supporting my claim as a Florida resident for tuition purposes. My parent has maintained legal residence in Florida for at least the past 12 consecutive months. As defined by section 1009.21(1)(d), Florida Statutes, "legal residence" or "domicile" means a person who has maintained his or her residence in this state for the preceding year, has purchased a home which is occupied by him or her as his or her residence, or has established a domicile in this state pursuant to s. 222.77. A copy of your parent's tax return may be requested to establish dependence.

I am an independent person who has maintained legal residence in Florida for at least the past 12 consecutive months. I provide more than 50% of my own support. An independent student generally includes a person who is at least 24 years old, married, a graduate or professional student, a veteran, a member of the armed forces, a widow or widower, someone with legal custody of a child, a spouse, or a parent of a child in the United States (as part of a lawsuit for the purposes of residential status only). There may be limited cases where a person under the age of 24 years old may qualify as an independent student. Such students will be required to verify independence (including financial independence). A copy of your tax return may be requested to establish independence.

- I was previously enrolled at a Florida state postsecondary institution and classified as a Florida resident for tuition purposes. I abandoned my out-of-state domicile less than 12 months ago and am now re-establishing Florida legal residence.
- Active duty members of the Armed Services of the United States residing in this state and their spouses and dependent children, and Reserve drilling members of the United National Guard. (Required: Copy of military orders or DD2062 showing home of record.)
- Active duty members of the Armed Services of the United States and their spouses and dependents attending a Florida College System institution or state university within 10 miles of the military establishment where they are stationed, if such military establishment is within a county contiguous to Florida. (Required: Copy of military orders.)
- United States citizens living on the island of Panama, who have completed 12 consecutive months of full-time work at the Florida State University Panama Canal Branch, and their spouses and dependents on duty. (Required: Copy of marriage certificate or proof of dependency.)

There may be limited cases where a person under the age of 24 years old may qualify as an independent student. Such students will be required to verify independence (including financial independence). A copy of your tax return may be requested to establish independence.

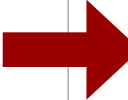

- Active duty members of the Armed Services of the United States residing in the state and their spouses and dependent children, and active drilling members of the Florida National Guard (Required: Copy of military orders or DD2058 showing home of record)

- Major grant doctoral fellows and scholars who are United States citizens. (Required: Verification from graduate schools.)
- United States citizens living outside the United States who are studying at a Department of Defense Dependence School or an American International School and who enroll in a graduate-level education program which leads to a Florida teaching certificate. (Required: Proof of enrollment in graduate program for Florida teaching certificate)
- Active-duty members of the Canadian military residing or stationed in this state under the North American Air Defense (NORAD) agreement, and their spouses and dependent children attending a Florida College System institution at state university within 50 miles of the military installation where they are stationed. (Required: Proof of active-duty membership for issuance purposes)
- Active-duty members of a foreign nation's military who are serving as liaison officers and are residing or stationed in this state, and their spouses and dependent children attending a Florida College System institution or state university within 50 miles of the military establishment where the foreign liaison officer is stationed. (Required: Proof of active-duty membership for issuance purposes)

## FLORIDA RESIDENCY DECLARATION FOR TUITION PURPOSES

A Florida "resident for tuition purposes" is a person who has, or a dependent person whose parent or legal guardian has, established and maintained legal residency in Florida for at least twelve (12) consecutive months preceding the first day of classes of the term for which Florida residency is sought.

- Residence in Florida must be bona fide domicile (other than for the purpose of maintaining a residence incidental to enrollment in an institution of higher education).
- To qualify as a Florida resident for tuition purposes, you must be a U.S. citizen or foreign national in a non-immigrant visa classification that grants you the legal ability to establish domicile for domicile in the United States, a permanent resident alien (parolee, asylum claimant, or an entry, registration, or naturalization fee waiver), or other qualified alien as defined under federal law. Other persons not meeting the two-year domicile legal residence requirement may be classified as Florida residents for tuition purposes only if they fall within one of the limited special categories authorized by the Florida Legislature pursuant to section 1009.22, Florida Statutes (see "Classification by Exception" below).
