

Description of Program

The Automotive Maintenance and Light Repair program focuses on the knowledge and skills needed to work on a variety of systems such as engine, drivetrain, brakes, electrical, and steer & suspension. Students learn to conduct basic repairs and maintenance on automobiles and light truck systems. This program is designed for those who wish to be certified in basic entry skills as a service technician. This certificate will aid students in obtaining an entry-level position at either a dealership or an independent repair facility. Upon completion, the goal is to give the technician well-rounded entry-level knowledge in all 8 of the areas that are covered under the industry standard of Automotive Service Excellence (ASE).

General admissions and registration procedures are as follows:

1. Attend Orientation

Program specific orientation is held Monday through Thursday. To register for orientation:

- **Main (Hollywood) Campus:** Report to Building 11, Office of Student Affairs no later than 8:30 a.m Monday-Thursday.
- **West (Pembroke Pines) Campus:** Report to the main office no later than 8:00 a.m. on Tuesdays.

2. Apply for Financial Assistance (OPTIONAL)

If you require financial assistance please complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) as soon as possible. Delays in completing the financial aid process may affect your ability to register on time.

3. Take the Test of Adult Basic Education (TABE)

Students enrolled in a postsecondary program of 450 hours or more are required to take and pass a basic skills test in order to receive a vocational certificate at the time of program completion. The TABE computer-based test assesses students in the areas of reading, math and language. Test accommodations may be available for individuals who self-identify as having a documented disability. Requests for accommodations must be made prior to testing via the Exceptional Education Specialist.

- **Main (Hollywood) Campus:** (Pre-registration required)
Pre-registration (Building 11): Appointments for the TABE test must be scheduled at least one business day before the desired test day. Individuals enrolling the day before the desired test day must do so no later than 10:00 a.m. Those registering more than one day in advance can register M-TH 7:30 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. or F 7:30 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. Please report to Building 11, Office of Student Affairs to start the registration process. A \$15.00 test fee and valid state or government issued picture ID is required.

Test Schedule (Building 12): Testing is available M - TH at 8:30 a.m. and will take approximately 4.5 to 5 hours. On the scheduled test day, report to the lobby in Building 12 by 8:30 a.m. with a valid state or government issued picture ID and test registration receipt.

- **West (Pembroke Pines) Campus:** (Pre-registration NOT required)
Registration (Main Office): No appointment required. Please report to the Main Office no later than 8:00 a.m. to register for same day testing. A \$15.00 test fee and valid state or government issued picture ID is required.

Test Schedule (Main Office): Testing is available T, W, F at 8:30 a.m. and will take approximately 4.5 to 5 hours.

4. Counselor Interview

An interview with the program counselor/advisor is required to finalize the admissions process. Test scores cannot be provided over the phone. No appointment is necessary; however, please call to confirm the counselor's availability prior to arrival.

5. Register for Class

Registration is on a first come, first served basis and is complete once payment is processed. Prospective students can register upon receiving an acceptance letter. Registration is ongoing, so verify course availability and registration dates with the program counselor/advisor. Textbooks, uniforms, kits and all other required supplies must be purchased prior to the first day of class.
