Old Business:

Director Report: Mr. Moncilovich- Skills USA online competition; many students successfully completed skills

School Improvement Plan: Fareed Khan- Student engagement is an issue. Staff working on keeping students engaged and on attendance. It is currently at 98.4% online and face to face

COE: Mary Barba- Our Annual Report is due this Friday, Feb 19th, and is ready for submission. The data for this report is based on our 2018-2019 school year in which we had 31 unique programs, with over 1100 students complete their programs. Of those completers, 976 found employment in their related field. That's close to 90% employed. THIS is why we are here!

New Business:

High School Report: Fareed Khan on another meeting.

Mr. Laverde- AGE online- 380 students- 41 have earned first milestone; ABE- on campus 2 days weekly for remediation; access and career for SWD 35 students 16 working; practical nursing on campus 4 days a week 70 students in simulation labs; surgical tech 100% of students graduating in 10 days are employed.

Barrett Goldman- Programs: Automotive, Construction and Building Trades, Cosmetology, CVD

Commercial Vehicle Driving (CVD) Restructure smaller class sizes enrollment up

Construction and Building Trade enrollment down by 61 students (at 111) due to space and infrastructure.

ESOL 508 enrolled down by 286 because these students want to come to campus. Working on survey to determine how many would like to return to face to face learning

Automotive- 173 students down by 33 because of high school enrollment
