Jose Laverde- Nursing program internships are working in many areas for placement including ER. Other programs are running at full capacity.

Mary Barba: Topic: Cosmetology, Barbering, Facials Specialty

Highlights:

- Doing well. Heard from a new salon that her lead stylist is a Sheridan Graduate, and her 2nd stylist is also a Sheridan Grad. Ms. Henry is aware of their request for more Sheridan grads to work in the salon. These are the partnerships we all wish to gain and cultivate to ensure students find employment upon completion of their respective programs.
- Cosmetology has 72 currently enrolled students, with 30-40 projected new students in June.
- Barbering has 20 currently enrolled students, with 6 more students enrolled, which will fill the class
- Facials has 40 currently enrolled students and there are 40 students enrolled for June. That program is full.

Highlights:

- Program is running well. Current enrollment is 21. Projected new enrollment for June is 8-10 more students.
- Have had industry partners come in and speak with students. They are looking for Sheridan students to work in their restaurants. Chef McMahon has posted this information and the teachers are sharing how important it is to build these types of relationships in their industry.

- Cafeteria business has picked up quite a bit since students have returned to campus. We will see this flourish when we are all back in the fall.
