

Career Placement

Admissions Requirements

- 18 21 years of age
- Earned an ACCESS Points or Standard Diploma.
- Elected to defer receipt of your diploma (see below)
- On-site Observation to determine:
 - Social Communication Needs
 - Employment Skills
 - Independence Level
 - Desire and willingness for increased independence in the areas of employment, community living and independent adult living

**(On-site Observation includes classroom and/or community observation, student interview, review of records, current school staff input, and family input.)



Course Content

- Career Placement is a structured program which teaches employment skills and fosters independence toward the goal of obtaining competitive paid employment.
- Life skills necessary for success in the work place and future independent living are included as part of the curriculum.
- Career Placement students are provided with dedicated job coaches to assist them in obtaining and maintaining competitive paid employment.
- Through a collaborative effort, students will create their Transitional Individualized Education Plan (TIEP) to help them reach their go

Additional Skills Covered

- Employment Skills
- Job Search Skills
- Social Communication
- Peer & Co-worker Relations
- Paycheck Terminology (Understanding their paystub)
- Household Management
- Seeking Paid Employment
- Connections with Adult Agencies for persons with disabilities
- Transportation Training (if appropriate)

Diploma Deferment:

As an ESE student you are entitled to remain in the public school system through the age of 21 to continue your education.

- In order to do this you must defer receipt of your HS diploma which means that you earned your diploma and are choosing to allow your HS to hold it in the guidance department until you have completed one of the districts Transition Curriculum Programs (You will be participating in all graduation activities at your HS).
- Communicate with your ESE specialist and inform them that you would like to know what Transition Curriculum Programs SBBC offers and how you may contact them to get more information.
- Following completion of a transition curriculum program or if you withdrawal before completing or aging out you will be able to obtain your diploma certificate from your graduating HS.

What if I choose not to defer receipt of my diploma?

-I will not be able to remain a SBBC student and not be able to attend one of the districts Transition Curriculum Deferment Programs.



- Accept that the focus of the Career Placement program is to develop employment skills and foster independence, NOT academics.
- Accepting the responsibility of your son or daughter diligently working to obtain competitive paid employment.
 Failure to accept this responsibility may result in your son or daughter returning to their home high school or a more appropriate transition curriculum program within SBBC.
- Parents accept and display a willingness to foster independence, which is essential for long-term success.

Employment Myths:

Myth: My son or daughter gets SSI and will lose it if they become employed.

Truth: Adults with disabilities are able to work and receive their SSI. We will refer you to a WIPA Counselor, for FREE, who will educate you on the process
