CAREER DUAL ENROLLMENT FACTS

What is Career Dual Enrollment?

- CDE is an option for high school students to enroll in postsecondary courses earning credit toward both high school graduation and a career and technical program certificate.
- Students receive two additional quality points on their weighted GPA for every course taken within the program that is completed with a grade of "C" or better".

 *Excluding Cosmetology and Barbering

How do I know if I'm eligible?

- Any eligible 10th and 11th grade students who are enrolled in Broward County Public Schools can apply for Career Dual Enrollment.
- Pembroke Pines Charter High School students are eligible for enrollment.
- We do not enroll students from other charter schools or private schools.
- Students on PEP are not eligible to enroll.
- Home school students are eligible to attend if they are enrolled with Broward County Public Schools' Home Education Department.

Do my high school grades matter?

- YES! Students must have a minimum 2.0 unweighted GPA AND be on track for graduation, meaning ALL EOCs and FSA tests have been passed.
- Note: If summer scores determine that you have not met the above requirement, you will be ineligible for participation.

Is there a cost for Career Dual Enrollment (CDE)?

- No! High school students enrolled in CDE have the amazing opportunity to get the training from a postsecondary program without the worry of tuition.
- Books and one uniform will be provided for students. Additional uniforms can be purchased at the bookstore at Sheridan Technical College.
- Specific programs may require supplies. This information will be shared when starting the program.

ENROLLMENT

Where do I find the application?

- Applications can be found on Sheridan Technical College's website: https://www.sheridantechnicalcollege.edu/career-dual-enrollment/
- Applications MUST be typed. <u>Handwritten applications WILL NOT be accepted.</u>
- Once all information has been filled in, save and print the application. Both student and parent must sign.

How do I submit my application?

- Bring the completed, signed by a parent application to your school counselor.
- Your counselor will also sign off, approving your application and potential enrollment in Sheridan's CDE program.
- School counselors will send the completed application to Sheridan's CDE Department. Applications sent by students or parents WILL NOT be accepted.

I submitted my application. Now what?

- Once your application is processed, you will hear from someone from Sheridan's Career Dual Enrollment Department.
- This communication will be done through email, so be sure to check often and <u>look</u> in your Spam/junk folder.
- Further requirements for enrollment include attending orientation and taking the basic skills test.

What is the basic skills test?

- The basic skills test covers Math, Reading, and Language skills typically covered through 10th grade/Geometry.
- The test is only given at Sheridan Tech and must be scheduled with the CDE Department.
- You may be exempt if you have taken the ACT, SAT, or Accuplacer. You can send scores to <u>Dianne.Cariello@browardschools.com</u> to see if you have met the exemption criteria for basic skills.

Where is orientation?

- Orientation will be presented through an online module which will be sent to you after your application is processed.
- If you do not attend the orientation, you will not be eligible to attend Sheridan Technical College.

PROGRAM INFORMATION & SELECTION

Where are the technical programs scheduled?

- Sheridan's technical programs are located on our main campus at 5400 Sheridan St. in Hollywood, 33021.
- <u>EXCEPTION:</u> the 1st year Culinary Arts program is located at our high school campus at 3775 SW 16th St, Fort Lauderdale, 33312.

Will I get my first choice?

- Because there are limited seats in each program, you may not always get your first choice of programs.
- A member from Sheridan's CDE Department will contact you if you need to choose an alternative program.

I am going to be a senior. What does this mean for my program selection?

- Early Childhood Education and EKG are the only programs that finish in one school year.
- If you enter any other program as a senior, you will have to enroll as an adult after graduation to finish the program. Note: time commitment and cost of tuition can be discussed with an advisor in the Office of Student Affairs, prior to graduation.

Are there programs that seniors cannot take?

- Rising seniors can apply for any of Sheridan's program offerings, but juniors get priority in the following programs:
 - Cosmetology
 - Electricity
 - Culinary Arts

Can I change programs once school starts?

• It is very unlikely that you will be able to change programs once school starts, as our programs tend to fill quickly.

Do I have to wear my uniform every day?

- Yes! Uniforms are part of your grade and must be worn daily.
- Uniforms include program specific shoes and ID badges. There are also fingernail and hair restrictions for many of the programs.

Is there a test I have to take at the end of my program?

- Most programs have at least one industry certification exam associated with it. These are REQUIRED as part of your program.
- The school prepares you, and pays for, these exams.

TRANSPORTATION

Do I get transportation to Sheridan?

- If your home address is <u>SOUTH</u> of Sunrise Boulevard, you <u>ARE</u> eligible to get a bus to Sheridan.
- If your home address is <u>NORTH</u> of Sunrise Boulevard, you <u>ARE NOT</u> eligible for transportation to Sheridan.
- If you are home schooled or go to Pembroke Pines Charter High School, you <u>ARE NOT</u> eligible for transportation to Sheridan.

Where is the bus stop?

• This will be assigned during the summer and is based on your home address; you are <u>NOT</u> picked up at your high school.

What time does the bus pick me up?

- Stops can be quite early and will be published at the end of the summer.
- District buses go to our high school in Ft. Lauderdale first, then a bus will take you to STC.

How do I request a bus stop?

- Sheridan will request a bus stop for all eligible CDE students. The district will generate your bus stop.
- Bus passes will be available at the end of the summer.

Can I get transportation back to my high school?

- If your school is south of Sunrise Boulevard, <u>you will have a bus</u> for you to get back to your high school.
- If you go to Pembroke Pines Charter HS, <u>you will have a bus</u> for you to get back to your high school.
- If your school is north of Sunrise Boulevard, or if you are home schooled, <u>you will not have transportation from Sheridan</u> to your school.

If my parents drop me off, can I take the bus back to my high school?

• YES! You do not need to sign up for the buses that go back to your high school.

Can I drive to Sheridan?

• YES! Students can provide proof of their driver's license, registration, and insurance, at which time a parking pass will be issued.

SCHEDULING

On which days do I go to Sheridan?

- You will report to Sheridan every day.
- We follow the same calendar as all of Broward Schools, so if you do not have school at your high school, you will not come to Sheridan.
- If your school participates in PSD days, Sheridan is still in session; therefore, you are expected to attend your program.

Do I go to my home school first?

• No. You will come directly to STC.

What time does school start/end?

• Class begins at 7:00am. Students are dismissed at 9:40am; buses leave at 9:45am.

What happens when I get back to my high school?

- Your counselor will create your schedule, so you have all of your academic classes after 10am.
- You will return to school in time for lunch and your classes.
