Description of Program

The Early Childhood Education program prepares students for careers in early childhood settings, including roles such as early childhood educators, child care personnel, lead preschool and VPK teachers, before and after care workers, teacher assistants, child development specialists, camp counselors, directors or owners of child care centers, and family day care home operators. The curriculum includes child growth and development; health; safety; nutrition; behavior guidance technique; child abuse and neglect; and the rules and regulations governing child care. Students also study observation, screening and assessment methods; community, labor and environmental issues; current technology; language development and emergent literacy; and lesson and program planning. Emphasis is placed on implementing developmentally appropriate practices for children from birth through age eight, including those with special needs. The integration of theory and hands-on practice prepares students for the Florida Department of Education's Early Childhood Professional Certificate (ECPC), which is accepted as a Staff Credential by the Department of Children and Families (DCF). Graduates of the ECE/ECPC program are also eligible to pursue the national Child Development Associate (CDA) credential and may receive nine college credits at a Florida public university.

Additional Considerations

• Students enrolled in the Early Childhood Education program are required to complete, sign, and notarize the Affidavit of Good Moral Character at the beginning of the course. This legal document, issued by the Florida Department of Children and Families (DCF), affirms that the individual meets the moral standards necessary for employment, volunteering, or icensure in roles involving vulnerable populations, such as child care. By signing the affidavit, students declare under penalty of perjury that they have not been arrested, convicted, or entered a plea for any disqualifying criminal offenses outlined in Chapter 435 of the Florida Statutes. These offenses include, but are not limited to, child abuse, sexual misconduct, fraud, domestic violence, murder, and drug-related felonies. Please note that any such offenses may affect your eligibility to remain in the Early Childhood Education program and could impact future employment opportunities in the field. Florida Residency for Tuition Purposes

A "Florida resident for tuition purposes" is defined as someone who has, or a dependent person whose parent, legal guardian, or spouse has, established and maintained legal residence in Florida for at least twelve consecutive months prior to the first day of the academic term. Individuals who do not meet this requirement are classified as non-Florida residents and are subject to a higher tuition rate. To be considered for in-state tuition, applicants must complete the *Florida Residency Affidavit for Tuition Purposes* and submit *two supporting documents* that verify Florida residency. Basic Skills
