### Description of Program

The Ford-Automotive Student Service Educational Training (ASSET) Program is a two-year training program designed to prepare students for careers as professional automotive technicians. Offered in partnership with Ford Motor Company, Ford and Lincoln dealerships, and Sheridan Technical College, this program is designed to prepare students for careers as entry-level service technicians at Ford and Lincoln dealerships while earning an Associate in Applied Science (A.A.S.) degree in Automotive Technology. Students in the Ford-ASSET program benefit from a blend of classroom instruction and hands-on, paid work experience at a local dealership, working under the supervision of a Ford Senior Master Technician. The curriculum provides a strong foundation in advanced automotive service technology, mechanical skills, and academic knowledge. Students also receive access to OEM (Original Equipment Manufacturer) training that is recognized by Ford and Lincoln dealerships worldwide.

Training takes place at Sheridan Technical College's main campus in Hollywood and is structured to integrate theory with practical application. The curriculum is designed to prepare students for the Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) certification tests. Students have the ability to graduate as Master ASE Certified Technicians by completing all eight ASE certifications, demonstrating comprehensive expertise across key automotive service areas. Before being admitted to the program, prospective students are required to contact the program instructor to receive assistance with placement at a participating local dealership. ### Requirements for Admission

- Less than three points on driver's license

## Florida Residency for Tuition Purposes

A "Florida resident for tuition purposes" is defined as someone who has, or a dependent person whose parent, legal guardian, or spouse has, established and maintained legal residence in Florida for at least twelve consecutive months prior to the first day of the academic term. Individuals who do not meet this requirement are classified as non-Florida residents and are subject to a higher tuition rate. To be considered for in-state tuition, applicants must complete the Florida Residency Affidavit for Tuition Purposes and submit two supporting documents that verify Florida residency. For detailed information on acceptable documentation and to access the form, please refer to the admissions process or contact a program counselor or advisor for assistance.

## Basic Skills

Students enrolled in programs of 450 hours or more are required to take and pass a basic skills test in order to receive a Career Technical Education certificate upon program completion.

However, students enrolled in programs that are less than 450 hours are not required to take the basic skills test. Additionally, some students may qualify for exemptions based on specific criteria.
