Dear Sheridan Technical College Students, Parents/Guardians, and Community Stakeholders,

Sheridan Technical College is writing to inform you that the Main Campus in Hollywood, Florida, will be closed Tuesday, November 17 through Friday, November 20, 2026, to accommodate the FPL Switchgear Project. This essential electrical infrastructure work requires temporary campus closure so the project can be completed safely and efficiently.

During the closure, all Post-Secondary Career and Technical Education (CTE) classes assigned to the Main Campus will be conducted online. Classes remain in session, and students are expected to participate according to their regular schedules.

Instruction During the Closure

Post-Secondary CTE students should follow their regular class schedules and participate online as directed by their instructors. Instructors will provide lessons, assignments, demonstrations, review activities, and other learning experiences to support continued progress toward program competencies. Hands-on laboratory, shop, or technical activities that cannot be completed remotely may be replaced with alternative activities and rescheduled after students return to campus.

Sheridan Technical High School 11th & 12th Grade Magnet students will remain at the high school campus, 3775 SW 16th Street, Fort Lauderdale, FL 33312, for the full school day and participate online in their regularly scheduled Main Campus courses.

Sheridan Technical College Share-Time CDE Students will remain at their respective home high schools and access Sheridan Technical College coursework online.

Technology, Attendance, and Student Support

Before November 17, students should confirm that they have the technology and internet access needed for online instruction; know how to access classes, assignments, materials, and instructor communications; retrieve necessary materials, equipment, and personal items from the Main Campus; and review remote-learning schedules and expectations.

Students who anticipate technology, connectivity, equipment, or other barriers should contact their instructor or program administrator as soon as possible. Additional information regarding technology assistance and student resources will be provided a few weeks before the temporary closure.

Attendance requirements remain in effect November 17–20, 2026. Students are expected to attend and actively participate in scheduled online classes, complete assignments, and remain engaged with their instructors. Attendance and participation will be monitored in accordance with applicable school and district procedures.

Campus Access and Key Dates

Due to the electrical work, students, parents/guardians, faculty, staff, and visitors should not access the Main Campus November 17–20 unless specifically authorized by Administration. Students must retrieve essential materials, equipment, and personal belongings no later than Monday, November 16.

- **Monday, November 16:** Final day to retrieve needed items and prepare for remote learning.
- **Tuesday, November 17 – Friday, November 20:** Main Campus closed; Post-Secondary Main Campus CTE classes conducted online.
- **Monday, November 30:** Anticipated return to normal on-campus operations, subject to successful project completion and final administrative confirmation.

Staying Informed

Our goal is to minimize disruption, maintain continuity of learning, and ensure this important infrastructure work is completed safely. Students and families should monitor communications from Sheridan Technical College and individual instructors for remote-learning procedures, technology support, student resources, and project updates.

Questions about a student's class, schedule, assignments, or remote-learning expectations should be directed to the student's instructor or appropriate Sheridan Technical College administrator.

We appreciate the cooperation, patience, and flexibility of our students, families, faculty, staff, and community during this temporary closure. Thank you for your continued support of Sheridan Technical College and our commitment to providing high-quality career and technical education.
